Be equipped with an ABC incurring extinguisher and a smoke detector on all floors, including the set and the portion. Be free from chipped or peeled paint on walls and surfaces. Mobile and equipment must be in secure repair. Have at least one leave directly to the outside if the portion of the portion is used for childcare. Have a first aid kit. You must have a work phone number. It has a place to isolate a child that gets sick. It has protective toppings on electrical outlets. It has partitions placed around space heaters, fireplaces, radiators or other sources of heat to prevent children from touching. Have inaccessible storage areas for children for tools, gardening equipment and other hazardous materials. Have a safe outdoor space for active game such as a backyard, nearby park or a children's playground. The game space must be protected by a sealing or caregiver supervision against risks, such as traffic, swimming pools or construction.
